**The declaration is to be completed by the person living in Iceland, who is to receive the visit from his/her partner. The declaration must be signed by both partners. The final decision to allow or deny entry into the country is made by border guards upon arrival.**

**Make sure you have all the necessary documents to be provided upon arrival**

- A valid travel document (passport).
- A valid visa (if applicable).
- Joint declaration on long-term intimate relationship (see form B).
- Certificate of residency from Registers Iceland (or other proof of legal domicile of either party in Iceland)
- Border guards may, if necessary, request further confirmation of intimate relationship, such as photographs; copies of e-mails, messages or any other form of communication that have been sent between the parties; and/or that the couple have met in person at least once (e.g. by stamps in passports or travel documents). It is recommended, therefore, that persons carry such documentation with them to confirm their relationship.
